


e are happy to announce the arrival of the new 3-CD set of music byLeo Sowerby as played and conducted by Alexander McCurdy and Paul Callaway in private recordings published by The Leo Sowerby Foundation.

Discs 1 and 2 feature Dr. Sowerby's Lenten Cantata "Forsaken of Man" in a live performance at First Presbyterian Church, Philadelphia on April 7, 1971 with Alexander McCurdy, organist-choirmaster. This historic performance marked Dr. McCurdy's final concert in his role as organist-choirmaster at First Presbyterian Church.

Disc 3 features music from Dr. Sowerby's memorial service held at Washington National Cathedral on October 19, 1968 with Paul Callaway, organist-choirmaster. Selections include Sowerby - Very

Broadly (from "Symphony in G Major") played by Ronald Stalford; Sowerby – Psalm 122 (accompaniment played by John Fenstermaker; Sowerby – Come, Risen Lord; Sowerby - I Will Love Thee, O Lord, My Strength (accompaniment played by Mr. Fenstermaker);

Preface and Sanctus (Sowerby - Service in C Major); Sowerby - Agnus Dei (Service in C Major); Sowerby – Lord, to Thee We Lift Our Voices; and Sowerby - Requiescat in Pace (played by Paul Callaway).





Michael Ondon Stairs



Michael Ondon Stairs, 72, was the consummate musician and teacher. He inspired scores of students during his twenty-five years at the Haverford School and prior to that the University of the Arts. He is also remembered by many as the long-time organist for the Philadelphia Orchestra, having been appointment to that post by Ricardo Muti in 1985, and earning the respect of some of the finest conductors in the world.

A graduate of both the Westminster Choir College and the Curtis Institute, Stairs was a former Dean of the Philadelphia Chapter of the AGO. He also served on the executive board of the Friends of the Wanamaker Organ. He was part of the delightful Philadelphia Organ Quarter, full of humor and virtuosic performance, along with Peter Richard Conte, Rudy Lucente, and Colin Howland.

Michael Stairs is equally known as an eminent and revered church musician, serving as director of music at the Church of the Redeemer in Bryn Mawr for over twenty-five years. He also worked with countless other churches, synagogues, schools and other Philadelphia area musical groups. Other artistic pursuits include many years assisting at the famed Wanamaker Organ at Macy's, Philadelphia, as well as performing and recording at Longwood Gardens, Girard College and other venues throughout the city, the United States, and internationally. Michael Stairs also served on many advisory and administrative boards of musical and performing arts organizations;

being known for his wisdom and keen insight in helping these groups further the arts in Philadelphia and beyond. Michael's gentle and loving personality earned the respect and admiration of friends, students, congregations and audiences. His humility and grace inspired all who crossed his path. His enormous talent and his quick sense of humor endeared him to everyone.

Dr. Jerry L. E. Wright

Dr. Jerry L. E. Wright, age 74, of Collingdale, beloved organist of Aldan Union Church for nearly 40 years, went home to be with his Lord on Monday morning, January 29, 2018. Dr. Wright had a God-given musical ability. He was a child prodigy who used his ability to serve the Lord. He was heavily involved in music, mostly sacred, his entire life. He studied piano with Mrs. Alice S. Harrison for 11 years.

After graduating from Collingdale High School in 1961, he continued his training in the field of music, attending Philadelphia College of Bible and accompanying the college chorale. He received a Bachelor of Music in Applied Music from Philadelphia Musical Academy under Dr. Earl Ness. He pursued graduate studies at the Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore, MD under Mr. Albert Russell. He then received a Doctor of Musical Arts in Sacred Music from the Combs College of Music in Philadelphia.

During his professional career, Dr. Wright served as an organist and/or pianist for a number of churches: he began his ministry at the age of 12 as the organist for the Church of the Nazarene in Collingdale, PA from 1955-1962; organist for Westminster United Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia from 1962-1966; organist for Catonsville Presbyterian Church, MD from 1966-1968; organist for Swarthmore Presbyterian Church from 1968-1976; pianist for Rose Tree Church of the Nazarene in Media from 1972-1976; organist for Temple Israel Synagogue in Upper Darby from 1973-1976; and organist at Aldan Union Church in Aldan, PA from 1976-2015. He was also a private piano and organ instructor from 1968-2014.



Some noteworthy accomplishments are his accompaniment at the Philadelphia Academy of Music for Joan Sutherland's performance of the opera Faust; his piano accompaniment for voice auditions at the Academy of Music and Carnegie Hall, New York, NY; and recitals in Baltimore, Swarthmore, Washington D.C., Philadelphia, Wilmington, Aldan, and Columbia University.

Dr. Wright was the son of the late Elbert B. and Miriam L. (nee Raughley) Wright. He spent the last few years of his life sharing the home of Pastor and Mrs. Paul Thompson of Aldan Union Church with whom he had worked for 40 years.
