

# The Philadelphia AGO Chapter's Archive

he Philadelphia Chapter's Archive Committee has been meeting monthly at the Organ Historical Society at Stoneleigh in Villanova for over a year. It is a working committee with the primary task of organizingchapter historical materials under the direction of OHS Archivist, Bynum Petty. The committee assists OHS with their workas well and has been kindly granted work and storage space on the third floor. The goal is for the Philadelphia Archive to be an archive within OHS.

You can help! Are you a "seasoned" member of our chapter or have you "inherited" organ stuff from such a person. Maybe it's in a box in your basement or attic. You might have out of print organ music by a Philadelphia composer that came into your possession somehow. Don't throw it out. Donate it to the Archive!

Here's a general list of what the archive is looking for:

- 1. Published and unpublished music of any kind by Philadelphia organist composers such as Harry Banks 1889-1967; Hugh A Clarke 1839-1927; Robert Elmore 1913-1985; William Wallace Gilchrist 1846-1916; Philip Henry Goepp 1864-1936; Ralph Kinder 1876-1952; Rollo Maitland 1884-1953; H Alexander Matthews 1879-1973; Frederick Maxson 1862-1934; Frances McCollin 1892-1960; Russell King Miller 1871-1939; Vincent Persichetti 1915-1987; Albert Henry Rosewig 1846-1929; Samuel T Strang 1855-1921; David D Wood 1838-1910;
- 2. Crescendos (especially before 1977, 1981-1993, and 1997-present) The Philadelphia Free Library has collected most Crescendos from vol. 4 1941/42. Our archive seeks its own physical copies.

- 3. Extant artifacts and papers of deceased Philadelphia area organists.
- 4. Philadelphia Chapter member directories.
- 5. Philadelphia Chapter Executive Committee Minutes. (We have many, but there are gaps.)
- 6. Chapter workshop programs and brochures (i.e. Krisheim / January Jumpstarts)
- 7. The 1930 Philadelphia National AGO Convention program.
- 8. Anything relating to the American Organ Players Club, a national organization based in Philadelphia begun in 1890 (predating the AGO by six years) and continuing into the late 20th century or the National Association of Organists founded in Ocean Grove, NJ in 1908 with Philadelphia Conventions in 1921 and 1926 which merged with the AGO in 1935.
- 9. Philadelphia area organ related programs, brochures, and publications of any era.
- 10. Pertinent photographs or recordings.
- 11. Church bulletins with relevant information.
- 12. Other stuff?

# Preserving the Past | Curating the Future

n May of this year, C.B. Fisk Op. 150 was inaugurated at Christ Church, Philadelphia. Also at that time, the company offered its archives of organs built during the lifetime of Charles Fisk—comprising Op. 1–81—to the OHS for digitizing and preservation. The first collection to be digitized was Op. 75, built for the University of North Carolina School of the Arts in 1977. Grant money was obtained, and the digitization process was completed in the facilities of the Northeast Document Conservation Center, Andover, Massachusetts. In time, the digitized files of Op. 75 will be uploaded to the OHS Library and Archives Special Collections webpage, and made available to the public without charge.

In 1966, a young man from Dayton, Ohio, began his organ building apprenticeship under the watchful eye of Charles B. Fisk, and two years later that young man—John Brombaugh—established his own company that flourished until his retirement in 2005. In October 2018, Brombaugh reached agreement with OHS Archivist, Bynum Petty, to transfer his business archives to the OHS for preservation and digitization.

Acquisition of the Fisk and Brombaugh archives are seminal events in OHS history, and confirm the organization's commitment to preserving the legacy of American organ building regardless of style or historic period.

To this end, I am reminded of the story of George Gershwin's 1928 trip to Europe where he met Alban Berg. To greet Gershwin, Berg arranged for a string quartet to perform his Lyric Suite. But in turn, Gershwin was hesitant to play some of his own songs, as he was intimidated by the quality of the Lyric Suite, to which Berg responded, "Mr. Gershwin, music is music." And so the same sentiment might be said of the pipe organ.

Thus it is that in October 2019, the OHS will host a symposium focusing on a style of organ building once regarded in the late 20th century as rubbish: the instruments of E.M. Skinner. Skinner's Op. 878, now installed at Stoneleigh, will be the subject of recitals, lectures, and roundtable discussions. More information about this important event will appear in subsequent issues of the Crescendo.




