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### **DEAN'S MESSAGE**

### AGO Leadership Training



've just returned from the first AGO Leadership Training Event, where 4 representatives from every region around the nation came together with members of our National leadership team for an intense day looking at membership trends in AGO, and ways we can build our membership, and the ties between members of AGO.

We know that over the last twenty or more years, membership in AGO has declined, as older members aged out, and younger members have strategically and critically asked how AGO fits their needs. AGO wants to be positioned as the association for members: players, musicians (professional and amateur) and aficionados of organ-playing. To this end, AGO has had to take a hard look at some long-held beliefs and perceptions about the association. To name just a few:

- AGO is exclusively for 'professional' musicians
- I don't have a place in AGO because I only work part-time at the organ
- There 's no place for me in AGO because I play a digital instrument.
- I play piano at my church. I'm curious about the organ, but how do I get involved?
- I don't know anyone in the local AGO chapter

Our time together helped to break down these and other perceptions, and encouraged us as Chapter leaders to reach beyond our stereotypical ideas of AGO membership. We were encouraged to look at musicians and music lovers in our spheres of influence who look somewhat differently from what we may have perceived to be traditional members of AGO:

- To be more welcoming to visitors and new members
- To embrace and assist those who play digital instruments
- To look to our teachers and those who have studios as potentially interested in the activities of a local AGO Chapter
- To program combined events with musicians in other, local, realms of music-making
- To invite invite INVITE! Because personal invitation is still the most effective means of bringing a new member into our ranks.

More thoughts coming in the next months. But for now, thank you for sponsoring me to go to this event!



The St. David's organ was designed and built by the Dobson Pipe Organ Builders of Lake City, Iowa and installed in 2007. The organ has mechanical key action and an electric stop action with multi-level combination action. It has 3-manuals, 47 ranks and 2,751 pipes. The deliberations about the tonal and mechanical design of Opus 84 were guided by the desire for a supportive acoustic with simple voices that would sound through the chapel with gravity and nobility. This servant-organ emphasizes thoughtful relationships between individual voices and careful chorus-building on multiple levels. Perhaps the instruments most distinctive feature is its Choir division which creates true accompanimental sounds. The organ stands a little more than 35 feet tall and weighs about 28,000 pounds.

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

The May 2018 edition of "The American Organist" includes an article by Erin Scheessele about Orgelkids USA, a project born of the curiosity of her 6-year old son Peter. Orgelkids began in the Netherlands, but thanks to Peter is now spreading throughout the United States.

There is presently no Orgelkids kit in the Philadelphia region, but we will be fortunate to receive one on loan soon.

On Saturday March 23, The Organ Historical Society will host a workshop to demonstrate and build this real, functioning pipe organ. 

We are sad to share the news that another of our long time members - a former chapter Dean, and a truly remarkable woman - passed away January 19 of this year at the age of 89.

Catherine Millikin Robinson, of Lansdowne, PA was both an accomplished musician and fine artist, and among her most wonderful accomplishments was a beautiful marriage to Robert Robinson of 65 ½ years. Their family includes four daughters, nine grand children, and three great grand children. Born in Bethlehem, PA, she had lived in Lansdowne over 70 years.

I had the privilege of being one of the many young children to study 'Art on the Porch' at Catherine's house in Lansdowne MANY decades ago, and I was delighted to re-discover Catherine in the AGO. Catherine was the Sub Dean of the Philadelphia Chapter of the AGO from 1981 - 1983. She was Dean from 1983 - 1985 and attended the AGO convention in San Francisco. She was Secretary in 1999 and Executive Secretary for the 2002 convention. As an organist and choir director she had a career that spanned 61 years, 25 of which were for Temple Lutheran Church in Havertown from which she retired in 2010 (see Crescendo, September 2010.) She also served All Saints Episcopal Church, Wynnewood for 19 years, Lansdowne Baptist Church, St. James of Kingsessing Episcopal Church in Philadelphia, and St. John the Evangelist in South Philadelphia.

The Fine Arts side of her career included graduating from Moore College of Art and teaching art at the Hillcrest Elementary School. She later taught art and gave piano lessons at her home in Lansdowne for many years. She exhibited her paintings at the yearly Rittenhouse Square Art Show and the Fitler Square Community Show. She also had exhibits at the Twentieth Century Club and Kentmore Park in Maryland. She had studied under Domenic DeSteffano and belonged to the Philadelphia Water Color Society, the Delaware County Art League and the Pennsylvania Water Color Society.



She and her husband enjoyed traveling to France (Bordeaux and Paris) to visit "family", Oregon (to visit daughter), Florida, Labrador/Newfoundland and Bermuda. Catherine and her husband have a summer home near Georgetown, MD, which the children also share. got to thinking about teaching and teachers, and how we may never realize the impact we've had, but how important it is to try to inspire, motivate, build skills and foster learning. I have two Lansdowne connections to share that relate to this topic.

I grew up in Lansdowne, Delaware County, until middle school, and I have wonderful though somewhat misty memories of Catherine Robinson, whom we remember in this issue of Crescendo. I was one of many young children who flocked to her 'Art on the Porch' art classes. When I later moved away and became an organist, I was inspired discovering that she incorporated music and art masterfully in who she was throughout her life.

Our twin house neighbors were the Stouffers who became like an extension of family. Paul Stouffer was music teacher and band leader at the local high school, as well as a composer and very involved with the Lansdowne Symphony. His daughter Tish, now a writer living in California, happened to find a Lansdowne FaceBook page and while there, heard from a former student of Paul's. Here's their exchange:

Are you Mr Stouffer's daughter? My name is Dave from Fairview Ave.

Yup, I'm his daughter and only child. I remember you. We lived on Linden Avenue, so you were pretty much in my neighborhood.

Yes we were neighbors. Your dad was a major Blessing in my life! I hope that all is well with you and your family. Your dad was one of the reasons that I am a musician. He gave me a shot when I did not know a thing about reading music. I will never forget him!!

He would have been so pleased to know this. He always wanted to be a musician, but his parents considered it an unsuitable profession and apprenticed him to a printer. He left that as soon as he could and put himself through school to become a music teacher and later got an MFA in composition. I think he was especially sympathetic to children who wanted to be musicians and faced obstacles.

I would welcome your stories of wonderful teachers, or wonderful student experiences. May we all help to fill hearts with music!!
