Orgelkids USA tours Philadelphia Area

rgelkids USA is a small, fully functional pipe organ designed to teach children of all ages how a pipe organ works. The kit arrived in Harleysville in a shipping case in mid-March and was built 33 times by a total of 460 people. Vincent M. Ryan, Minister of Music at Advent Lutheran Church, Harleysville presented the instrument to 29 classes in

local schools and communities before delivering it to its next destination in York, PA. Orgelkids USA, a non-profit organization based in Corvallis, OR, is directed by Erin Scheesele. Originating in the Netherlands, it was brought to the USA by Erin with a lot of help from her son. For the full story, visit www.orgelkidsusa.org.

Some highlights of the Philadelphia area Orgelkids tour included:

- The Adult Sunday School class at church not only built this organ, but did so adjacent to our sanctuary instrument. They were able to compare and contrast the two, even using proper terminology. Are there many parishioners (not involved with an organ build or restoration) who can do so?
- We formed a small instrument ensemble that played along with the organ to lead worship for three Sundays.
- Prior to class, one middle-school teacher informed me that the 8th grade boys would usually rather be elsewhere. My expectations were set to encounter some resistance. Of the 56 students that day, these ten boys were the most engaged! They were attentive from the moment they entered the room, through the building process, playing and disassembly.
- On a Saturday evening, we hosted a Pipes and Pinot Party. A relaxing evening of friends gathered for hors d'oeuvres, wine, and organ building (and playing).
- A high school senior was completely and viscerally joyful when the organ began playing. An elementary school student giggled uncontrollably.
- Fifth grade girls were spotted writing down terminology (unprompted) such as mortise, tenon and tusk, as well as the website for www.orgelkidsusa.org so they could learn more at home.

The typical construction began with a life-skills question: "How do you get the elephant out of the jello box?" Ans: "Read the instructions!" 133 pieces were laid out on three tables. Students were given brief instructions and divided into groups. Each group also had clear printed instructions that described every step. Despite some requisite explanation, my goal was to allow the students the room they needed to explore – with teamwork - by doing. Once a group

completed a step, they were expected to explain what they did and how it works to the rest of the class. The groups then combined to learn from each other and create the final assembly. They took turns as calcant and organist. The organ was usually completed and played in about 40 minutes.

Ages of the students ranged from 5 to 90, and their backgrounds included musicians, science students, visual artists, organ builders, etc. Depending on the audience and time available, we were able to discuss organ history, ancient woodworking and joining techniques, the physics of sound in a pipe, math, tuning and wind pressure. Students were given age-appropriate handouts with worksheets or coloring pages, and invited to visit our church (or to speak to their own church organist) to see and hear a full-sized instrument.



Amanda Mole, first prize winner of the Eighth International Organ Competition Musashino-Tokyo, has made quite a statement with her debut recording on Naxos' *Laureate Series*! Bach, Bruhns, and Buxtehude are crisp and energetic under Mole's dexterous fingers.

Bruhns' large scale *Chorale Fantasia* on the well-known Advent chorale *Nun komm der Heiden Heiland* receives a particularly thoughtful performance in which equal attention is given to the chorale melody and the efforts Bruhns takes to ornament and elaborate on it.

Moments of exquisite phrasing and line occur in the Alain and Reger works, as well as ample opportunity for the introverted sounds of the organ to be heard. Included is an outstanding new work by Nico Muhly: *The Revd Mustard His Installation Prelude*, a 21St century "take" on Tutor-era virginal music, featuring a number of flute combinations on the 1984 Marcussen & Søn organ.

The program concludes with Olivier Messiaen's impressive *Dieu parmi nous*, where Mole, in a dramatic fashion, exhibits her skills as a thoughtful musician and able technician. You will enjoy this recording again and again.







ay you have a gentle and uplifting recovery from all the April Holy day liturgies, May you have some enjoyable down time, May you find new inspirations once you catch your breath, May you be able to enjoy some of the fantastic musical opportunities in our area, and May you have a safe and healthy end to the spring season!

I wanted to share a discovery I've made as a result of serving a congregation that for the time being is without an organ. (Some of the ranks from our old instrument are being used in a rebuild in Broomall, and the left-overs are in my garage and slowly have been making their way to various folks for various creative projects! Call me if you have creative ideas for some ...)

I have fallen in love all over again with some of the Baroque era chorale preludes by arranging them for piano and bells, with the bells taking the *Cantus Firmus*. Often that means bells are taking the place of pedals, but sometimes I rearrange and put pedal line in left hand, CF with bells, and other accompaniment in right hand.

I've been hunting down pieces that work well with this and have had particular fun with:


