DEAN'S MESSAGE

FOUNDATIONS for Friendships

ur Philadelphia Chapter is blessed not only by the unique instruments and venues surrounding our area, but also with the special relationships that we have with many of the local organizations who are the stewards for those venues:

I would like to specifically recognize the Organ Historical Society and past dean Marcia Sommers for all of the close interactions we have with them, furthering both of our missions. Marcia is the current chair of our nominations committee and with elections coming up, she'd love to hear from you if you've ever thought of volunteering in our chapter. I also would like to thank past dean Alan Morrison and his current class of Curtis School of Music students for furthering the educational aspects of the Guild's mission to the highest degrees of musicianship.

Ray Biswanger and Curt Mangel from Friends of the Wanamaker Organ and Nathan Bryson and Dennis Cook from the Historic Organs Restoration Committee in Atlantic City embody other examples of special relationships. Naturally, those were two of the instruments that initially drew me to the area when I was looking at colleges over a decade ago. It is remarkable what a profound impact those instruments can have, introducing those young and old to our repertoire in most unique and unusual environments.

Another unique venue in our area that happens to include a pipe organ within its walls is the ballroom at Longwood Gardens. 85,000 people passed through the ballroom during the holiday season this year and were treated to Longwood's annual, organ-accompanied Christmas sing-alongs. I sincerely thank Tom Warner, Emily Moody, and the event team there for featuring our chapter members prominently in their events.

This June will be the 10th Kimmel Organ Day, and I look forward to working closely with past dean Rudy Lucente, Jay Wahl from the Kimmel organization, and Michael Barone on an exciting program. One of the reasons that the Verizon Hall Dobson consistently sounds so good is due to one man. It's impossible to be in our area and not come across the name Steve Emery, the founder of Emery Brothers. They are the go-to firm whenever we have an event and the organ attempts to help out as much as it can by itself at the last minute. I have never encountered an organ in tighter tune than what Steve can accomplish, and we are all anxiously awaiting the completion of the rejuvenated instruments at both Holy Trinity, Rittenhouse Square and the Episcopal Cathedral. Those projects are led by Adam Diffenbach.



TALE PIPES

Given that St. Patrick's Day is so widely recognized and celebrated in our country, albeit often as an excuse for extra beer, I thought I would offer this hymn history which I also shared with ACMP

I Bind Unto Myself Today

his grand hymn is a favorite of teen students of mine, which led me to investigate further. It is attributed to St. Patrick, and according to a scholarly hymnal text was first found in two eleventh century manuscripts which became the *Irish Liber Hymnorum*. It's known as the 'Breastplate' or 'Lorica' of St. Patrick, or *Faeth Fiada* – "Deer's Cry." The author in my source suggested that while it wasn't metrical, perhaps the text had been written to be a visual representation, such as the shape of a breastplate. He quotes from the manuscript:

Patrick made this hymn; ...and the cause of its composition was for the protection of himself and his monks against the deadly enemies that lay in ambush for the clerics. And it is a Lorica of faith for the protection of body and soul against demons and men and vices: when any person shall recite it daily with pious meditation on God, demons shall not dare to face him....

Translator Alexander is said to have produced the metrical translation for St. Patrick's Day in 1889 to be made available in leaflets throughout Ireland. The hymn with this tune as found today has five verses set to minor mode tune *St. Patrick's Breastplate*, and a triumphant sixth verse to contrasting melody *Deidre* set in the relative major, and a final verse in the original minor. The first and sixth verses are:

- I bind unto myself today
 The strong Name of the Trinity,
 By invocation of the same,
 The Three in One and One in Three.
- Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort and restore me. Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in quiet, Christ in danger, Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger.

The hymn goes on in the verses to invoke Christ's baptism, death, and resurrection; angels, saints and patriarchs; the starlit heaven, sun, moon, lightning, wind and sea; God in all His glory and wisdom; some settings include verses about things to be protected from; the final verse returns to the Trinity. There are aspects within the original text of Druid incantations and references in some of these more arcane verses to seeking protection from wizards and such.

This hymn has been set by various composers, including Ralph Vaughan Williams and recently Libby Larsen, and has inspired various modern interpretations, including a children's song <u>God Beside Me</u>. Abbreviated versions of the text have been used on Catholic prayer cards.
