

A Letter from the OHS CEO

Dear Members of the Philadelphia AGO:

I am so thrilled that we will move the OHS offices to the Stoneleigh estate in VIllanova. Although that move is some months away, we now have an office in Philadelphia, and both my Program Assistant (Hazel Eaton - h.eaton@organsociety.org) and I (jweaver@organsociety.org) are looking forward to becoming closely involved with the members of the Philadelphia AGO. Hazel has already joined the Philadelphia Chapter, and I will also do that before the month is out. We will attend meetings and both of us plan to participate in the activities of the local group.

We are excited that the OHS Annual Convention will be held in Philadelphia in 2016, June 26 - July 2, including some activities that have not previously been available to the public We will have the full schedule announced during the month of December, and will depart from our usual registration practice (that includes full bus transportation) to establish cheaper fees to encourage local attendees to use their own transportation to participate.

OHS Archivist, Bynum Petty, is planning to meet with John Romeri and the Archivists of the Philadelphia AGO Chapter; we believe that we can support the Chapter by offering archival storage space for historic AGO materials. Before the year is out we expect to have a plan in place that will allow us to move forward to accomplish this goal.

I am also looking forward to participation in the AGO January Jump-Start on Saturday, January 16. Your Dean has graciously invited OHS to present our future plans, for the Annual Convention and for the move to the Stoneleigh Estate. 2016 marks the 60th Anniversary - the Diamond Anniversary - of the Organ Historical Society. In our presentation at the JumpStart (2:45-4:00pm) we will share all the details of the Convention. We will share the architectural plans at Stoneleigh, as well as our programming ideas for the space.

We look forward to meeting you there - and are grateful for this opportunity!

Dr. Dennis P. Schmidt, DMA October 13, 1949 – October



19, 2015. Dennis had many friends in the Philadelphia Chapter and spent much of his remarkable career in our area. He was born in LeMars, IA, and graduated from Dana College - in 1999 he received their Distinguished Alumnus Award. He earned Master and Doctorate in Musical Arts from the University of Michigan where he studied organ with Marilyn Mason, and a Master

of Divinity from Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, IA. He was a long time member of the AGO and of the Association of Anglican Musicians and performed recitals around the world. He served from 1993-2000 as Executive Director of the Bach Festival of Philadelphia and his two-volume work "An Organist's Guide to Resources for the Hymnal 1982" was published by Church Publishing in 1987 and 1991. He has also presented lectures on various topics at the University of Michigan and at AGO conferences He recorded the complete organ works of J.S. Bach while serving as organist-choirmaster at St. John's Cathedral in Albuquerque, New Mexico during the tercentenary celebration for Bach in 1984-1985.

Dennis Schmidt served as a musician at churches and schools in Nebraska, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, New Mexico, New Hampshire, Delaware and Pennsylvania, including serving for a time as minister of music at Grace Lutheran Church in Wyndmoor, PA. He also worked for a time at J.W.Pepper and Son in Paoli, PA.

His Requiem Eucharist was held Friday, Oct. 23, 2015, at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Wickford, RI. The family requests that in lieu of flowers, gifts may be made in Dr. Schmidt's name to the organ program of the School of Music at the University of Michigan, 1100 Baits Dr. Ann Arbor, MI 48190.

Sarah 'Sally' Freeman of the Quakertown area was a remarkable woman with many talents. She died in June 2015. According to one of her two sons, she attended West Chester when it was the State Teachers' College and earned her degree in Health and Physical Education. She taught for many years in the North Penn school district, mostly elementary, but also started a district wide Water Safety Program. She was such a remarkable teacher that for 17 years running her elementary classes were awarded the state wide teacher's award! She also was the first woman to be given an award by the Jaycees in her community. She played piano, organ, violin and flute, and upon retirement she attended the Conservatory at Westminster Choir College and earned their Church Music Certification. She served in many churches, including St. Peter's Covenant church in Hilltown from 1997-2011. She was in her 80's – her son said that she kept even them guessing by always saying she was 39!

It is with sadness that I share the following three notices of the passing of AGO members, and I thank our members for advising me.

Dr. Harry "Bucky" Clark, described as a fixture in the Hatboro community for much of his life, passed away at the age of 77 on September 29, 2015 in Warminster. A 1955 Hatboro Horsham graduate, he earned a BS in Music from Susquehanna University, a master's degree in Educational Administration, and his doctorate degree in Education, both from Temple University. He also did advanced graduate work at Penn State University, Harvard University, and Lehigh University. His early career included teaching in the Upper Moreland School District, then teaching and/or administration for Abington School District, Upper Perkiomen School District; and for Hatboro-Horsham School District. In 1971, he began his 43-year career with Centennial School District as principal of Log College Middle School in Warminster. He was the recipient of Centennial School District's Outstanding Educator of the Year Award, among many other awards. He also was an adjunct professor at Drexel University School of Educational Administration.

Dr. Clark also spent time working in the broadcast industry for KYW Radio (1970); for WBCB Radio, Levittown (1965), where he worked with Merrill Reese; as co-producer and moderator of Educational Programs for WBUX Radio, Doylestown (1969); for WTTM Trenton, N.J. (1952); as reporter for the Department of Educational Congress; and as host of his own radio program on WKOK Radio in Sunbury, PA, while at college.

Dr. Clark was involved in many musical activities throughout the community. He was an organist at Lehman Memorial Methodist Church, where had been a member since the age of three. He also was the organist at St. Paul's United Methodist Church, Warrington. and directed the Youth and Handbell Choirs at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Doylestown. He also served Gloria Dei Church, Huntingdon Valley, and Hatboro Baptist Church. He played piano at Conti's Cross Keys Restaurant in Doylestown and Café La Fontana's in Hatboro, and was a member of bands that played throughout the Delaware Valley. He had been a child performer on several wonderful classic local programs.

Bucky was a man of the community. He was on the Hatboro Borough Council from 1978 to 2005, and was Council president from 2002 to 2005. Bucky also enjoyed volunteering, including at the Union League as tour guide, every Christmas evening playing the baby grand piano in the Lenfest Building at Abington Memorial Hospital, and volunteering at the hospital's yearly June Fete. He was a member of the Broadcaster Pioneers of Philadelphia; the Montgomery County Industrial Development Authority; the Rotary of Warminster; and the Union League of Philadelphia. He was a Trustee of Abington Memorial Hospital; past Chairman of the Board of Warminster Hospital; a member of Old York Road Country Club. He was a Free Mason as member of W.K. Bray Lodge 410 of Hatboro, and a member of the Philadelphia Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

We also offer our sincere condolences to Arthur Zbinden on the death of his wife Angelika on May 27. They were able to celebrate their 50th wedding anniversary in August of 2014.
